How to get there by plane

Adolfo Suárez Madrid Barajas Airport is located just 15 km from Alcalá de Henares. Barajas is Spain's most important airport and the fifth in Europe in terms of passenger traffic, air cargo and number of operations.

In January 2006, the new Terminal 4 was inaugurated, increasing the airport's capacity by 70 million people. With its spectacular design, it was awarded the prestigious Stirling Prize for Architecture and has become one of the architectural landmarks of the Community of Madrid.

The city's proximity to Barajas Airport means significant savings in time and money for travellers. Alcalá has a direct intercity bus service to the airport. Line 824: check timetables and routes at www.crtm.es

Another great advantage for Alcalá de Henares is its proximity to the IFEMA exhibition centre, located 20 kilometres from the city.



How to get there by train

Alcalá de Henares is connected to Madrid via Renfe Cercanías Madrid on lines C2 and C7, which link the city with the capital. Trains run every 5 minutes during rush hour.

The city also has a CIVIS train service that connects Alcalá de Henares with Chamartín station in Madrid in just 20 minutes.

What to do in Alcalá?

Alcalá offers a wide range of high-quality leisure activities, including a diverse cultural and tourist offering. It is a city devoted to culture, considered the City of Arts and Letters and an intellectual and educational benchmark in the Community of Madrid and the rest of Spain.

Notable cultural events include the Alcalá Classical Theatre Festival, the Alcine Short Film Festival, the Don Juan performance in Alcalá (a Festival of Regional Tourist Interest), Cervantes Week, which includes the spectacular Cervantes Market (a Festival of Regional Tourist Interest), the Festival de la Palabra, held around the time of the Cervantes Prize for Literature award ceremony in the city, and Holy Week (Festival of Regional Tourist Interest). Every month of the year, Alcalá de Henares offers interesting, high-quality events for visitors.

These possibilities are complemented by its magnificent and unique gastronomic offerings, which bring together and update the best of Castilian cuisine and that inherited from references appearing in Don Quixote. Alcalá's theatres are also a national and international benchmark, as evidenced by the Clásicos en Alcalá festival and the presence of a unique gem of the European stage: the Corral de Comedias de Alcalá, founded in 1601 and considered the oldest theatre in Europe to have remained in continuous operation. And it always has a varied and attractive programme, which makes the city's theatres an essential venue for lovers of the performing arts.

Alcalá offers many other possibilities for leisure and relaxation, ranging from a wide variety of tourist routes and visits, the best sports facilities, the most entertaining nightlife, or the simple pleasure of strolling around and enjoying what the only World Heritage City in the Community of Madrid has to offer.

THE CITY OF THREE CULTURES

Medieval Alcalá, with its Christian, Jewish and Muslim quarters, can be explored thanks to a route that marks the locations of these historic areas. The spaces and memories of the mosque and the old synagogues, the Jewish butcher's shop, the merchants, the churches, the trades and the places that shaped and gave character to a medieval town full of contrasts and an example of coexistence. The ceramic plaques are located in key places in medieval Alcalá.

Depending on the neighbourhood to which they refer, they feature a cross, a crescent moon or a seven-branched candelabra as a symbol. In each neighbourhood there is a general plaque indicating its boundaries and the location of the other signs.

THE LITERARY CITY

The cultural importance of the city and its great university tradition have meant that its history is full of writers who described it, thought about it or were born there. These signs mark out a route through the places associated with the most important writers linked to Alcalá.

THE CITY OF STORKS

Historical and natural heritage are closely linked in the landscape of Alcalá. The settlement of storks in the city's historic buildings has led to the creation of a tourist itinerary that connects both elements. This route offers us a new way of getting to know the city.

DON JUAN IN ALCALÁ AND THE NIGHTS OF DON JUAN IN ALCALÁ

Open-air performance of José Zorrilla's immortal play. Two performances are usually held on 31 October and 1 November each year, as tradition dictates, coinciding with the feast of All Saints. It was declared a Festival of Regional Tourist Interest in 2002.

To complement this performance, during the month of November the Department of Tourism organises the dramatised tours Las Noches del Don Juan en Alcalá (The Nights of Don Juan in Alcalá). This is a romantic dramatised tour that takes in the historic centre of the city and includes special offers at hotels and restaurants in the city. A green city

The historic centre of Alcalá de Henares, thanks to its towers, spires and bell gables, is home to one of Spain's largest colonies of storks in an urban environment, giving the city a unique and special charm and adding value to its rich heritage.

On the other hand, the River Henares, a special conservation area, some 12 km long and located mostly in the urban area of the city, offers nature lovers a wide range of possibilities.

Alcalá has routes for nature lovers in the area around the Henares River and Los Cerros de Alcalá. These possibilities invite us to enjoy nature, thanks also to our climate, which has more than 3,000 hours of sunshine per year.

Los Cerros de Alcalá - Nature Classroom

Los Cerros de Alcalá has been declared a Public Utility Forest by the Community of Madrid. It is the green lung of Alcalá de Henares and its most important natural area, the place chosen to develop an extensive calendar of environmental education activities. There are four marked trails in this area: **the Tayares Trail, the Puerta Verde Trail, the Arab Castle Trail and the Ecce-Homo Trail.**

Arab Castle allows visitors to explore the remains of the Qal'at Abd-Salam fortress. Built in the mid-9th century, it is a privileged spot for contemplating the beauty of the riverside vegetation from the hills surrounding the city.

The routes can be done on foot or by bicycle. Bicycles can be hired from the Department of the Environment (telephone: 91 877 12 30). It is the place chosen by the people of Alcalá as a recreational area.

Henares River Eco Corridor

An easy route that runs along the right bank of the Henares River. The route has information panels explaining the flora and fauna of the area. It can be done by bicycle.

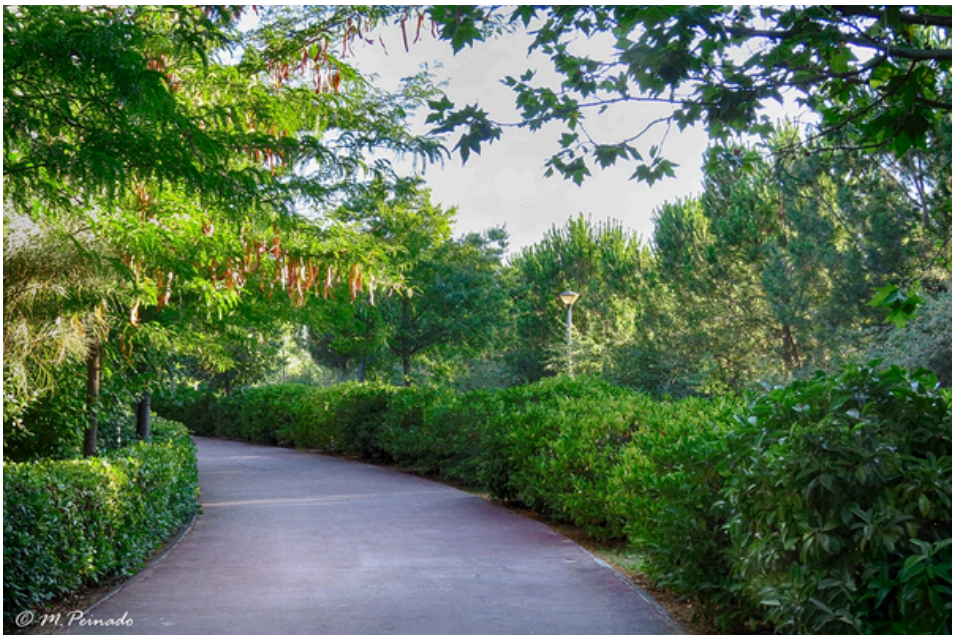

Gastronomy

Alcalá de Henares offers a wide variety of cuisine that combines traditional Castilian fare with avant-garde cooking, not to mention references to the cuisine of Don Quixote. The wide variety of restaurants covers all types of prices and menus, offers for groups, catering companies specialising in services for businesses, and restaurants in the historic centre where, thanks to the careful decoration, you will feel transported back to the time of Cervantes. In addition, throughout the year, the city takes centre stage in Madrid's gastronomic scene thanks to the prestigious events organised by Alcalá's restaurants and bars in collaboration with the Department of Tourism: Gastronomic Week in February, the popular Tapas Route and the Cervantes Gastronomic Days held around the celebrations commemorating the birth of Miguel de Cervantes in the city. Since 2014, the city has hosted the Alcalá Gastronómica competition.

As for shopping, the city is famous for its traditional bakeries, which have maintained their unique artisan traditions over time. The famous caramelised almonds of Alcalá are particularly noteworthy and can be purchased at the Convent of the Poor Clares of San Diego, a place of great tradition where the sweets are handmade by the nuns. The *costrada* and *rosquillas de Alcalá* are also among the typical products offered by our bakeries, which will sweeten your stay in the city.

Shopping

Shopping is the ideal complement to your stay in Alcalá de Henares. The city has several shopping centres and numerous establishments in the historic centre, with attention to detail and decoration, offering gifts and quality products. Many of them are located on Calle Mayor, the old Jewish quarter that has not lost its commercial function for more than 500 years, or in the old Plaza del Mercado, now Plaza de Cervantes, the centre of life in Alcalá de Henares.
